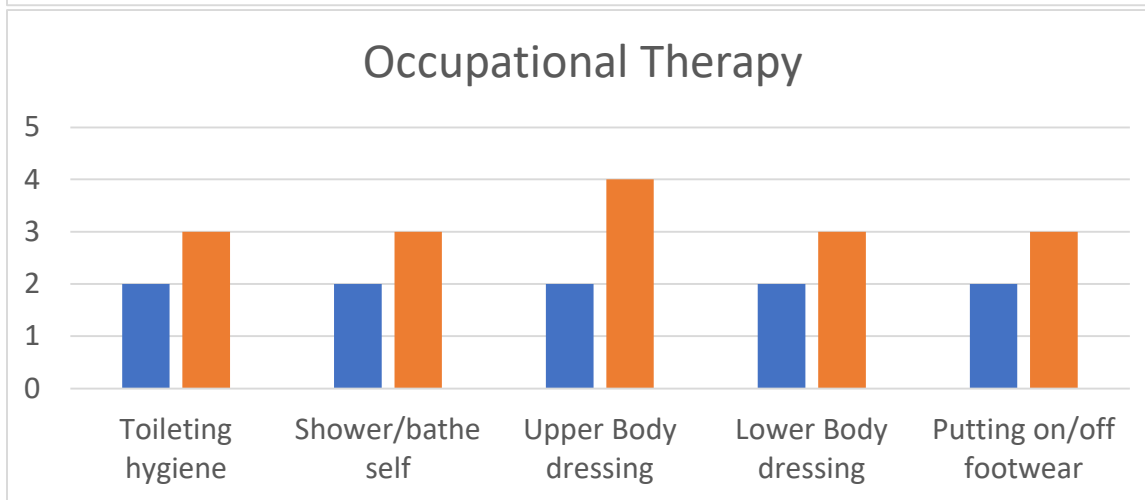
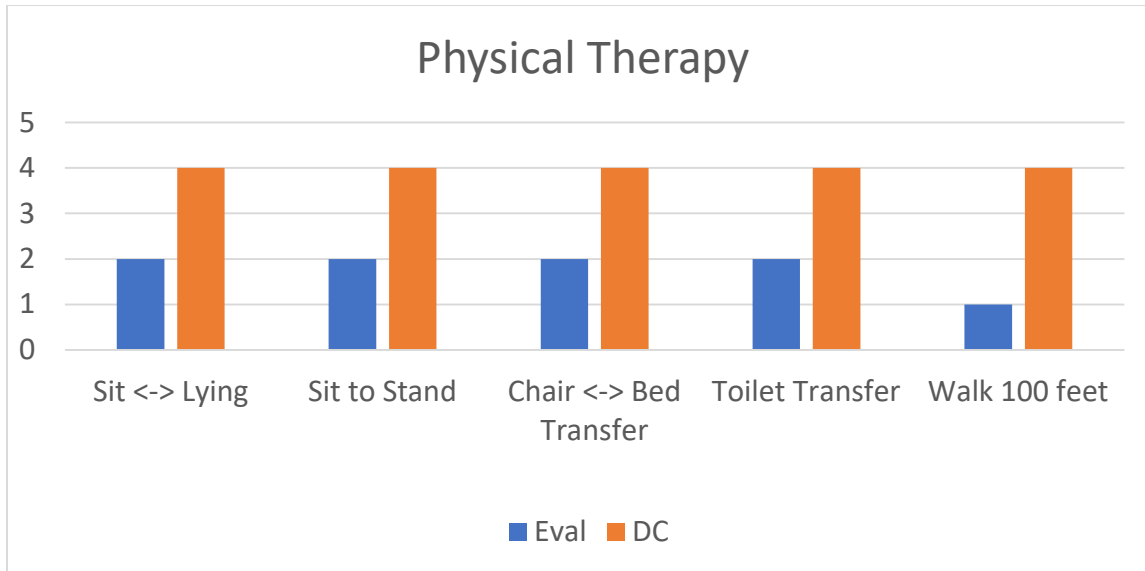


Mr. Bailey is a 75-year-old male who admitted to **Willowbrook Nursing & Rehabilitation Center** on 1/26/2024 from an acute care hospital after suffering from severe generalized weakness and was unable to care for himself.

PT evaluated Mr. Bailey on 1/28/2024, he was able to complete all bed mobility tasks with Moderate Assistance. He required Moderate Assistance during transfers and was able to demonstrate the capacity to propel himself in a manual wheelchair 20feet with Stand-by Assistance. Prior to his hospitalization, Mr. Bailey was modified independent for ambulation and gait. PT set goals to focus on improving functional transfers, balance, and gait, with the goal of discharging home with his wife.

OT evaluated Mr. Bailey on 1/28/2024. Upon evaluation he required **Maximum Assistance** with performing all toileting tasks and toileting transfers. He also required minimal assistance for upper body dressing and moderate assistance with lower body dressing and Maximum Assistance during shower/bathing. OT set goals to address increasing his bilateral upper-extremity strength for improved activity tolerance and functional task performance during self-care tasks, activities of daily living while sitting or standing unsupported and also to perform transfers to/from shower chair with **Modified Independence** (assistive device or extra time needed.).

Mr. Bailey made significant functional gains following 18 days of skilled nursing and therapy services. PT helped him achieve the ability to safely perform transfers with occasional Stand-by Assistance. He was able to ambulate **350ft** with a two wheeled walker and with Stand-by Assistance. He also made significant gains with OT where he demonstrated the ability to perform all Activities of Daily Living with **Minimal Assistance**. Mr. Bailey was able to safely discharge home with his wife and home health services of his choice on 2/12/2024.



MDS Section GG Functional Scores	
06 - Independent	Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
05- Setup or clean-up assistance	Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
04 - Supervision or touching assistance	Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
03 - Partial/moderate assistance	Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs but provides less than half the effort.
02 - Substantial/maximal assistance	Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
01 - Dependent	Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of two or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
