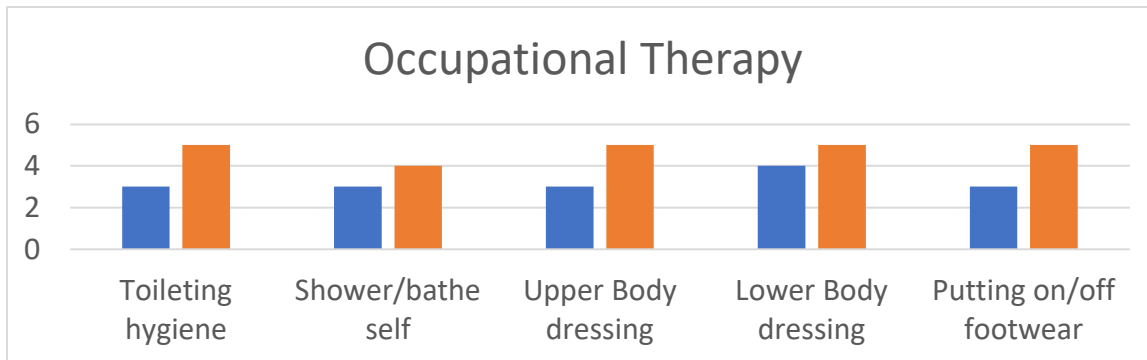
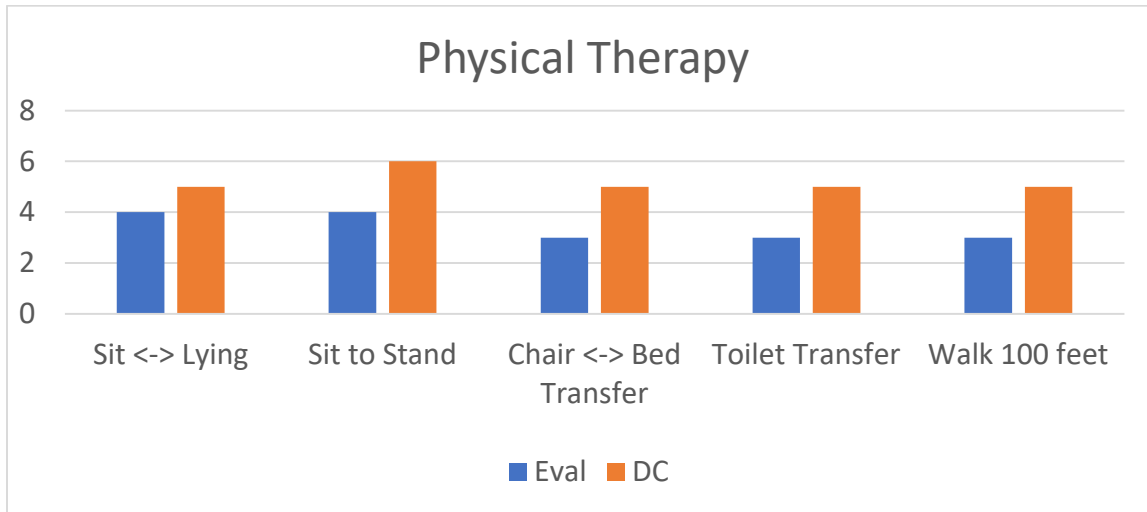


Mrs. Campbell is an 84-year-old female who admitted to Willowbrook Nursing & Rehabilitation Center on 4/17/2024 from an acute care hospital following surgery to treat a hemorrhage.

PT evaluated Mrs. Campbell on 4/18/2024, and she was able to complete all bed mobility tasks with Contact Guard Assistance and during transfers. She was able to walk 100-feet requiring Contact Guard Assistance and Verbal Cues for even step length due to her left leg's foot drop. PT set goals to focus on improving functional transfers, balance, and gait, with the goal of discharging back to home with family support versus long term care.

OT evaluated Mrs. Campbell on 4/18/2024, where she required **Moderate Assistance** with performing all toileting tasks and Minimum Assistance with toileting transfers. She performed upper body dressing with stand-by assistance and lower body dressing requiring Minimum Assistance. Mrs. Campbell also presented with poor activity tolerance. OT set goals to address increasing her bilateral upper-extremity strength and ROM for improved activity tolerance and functional task performance required during self-care tasks, activities of daily living, instrumental activities of daily living, as well as to perform transfers to/from shower chair with **Modified Independence** (assistive device or extra time needed).

Mrs. Campbell made substantial functional gains following a readmission to our facility and received 50 days of skilled nursing and therapy services. PT impacted her ability to safely perform transfers with Supervision. Mrs. Campbell was able to ambulate **300feet** with Supervision using a two wheeled walker and demonstrated improved scoring with the Timed Up and Go Test at 25seconds. She also made significant gains with OT where she demonstrated the ability to perform all Activities of Daily Living with **Supervision and Set-up Assistance**. Mrs. Campbell was admitted to our facility for Long Term Care as was recommended by our Interdisciplinary Team, and she has acclimated well with the transition.



MDS Section GG Functional Scores
06 - Independent Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
05- Setup or clean-up assistance Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
04 - Supervision or touching assistance Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
03 - Partial/moderate assistance Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs but provides less than half the effort.
02 - Substantial/maximal assistance Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
01 - Dependent Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of two or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
